Inflight maskwearing on the way out

Good news for travellers; the latest guidance recommends ditching masks when flying within Europe, a move that gained a welcome response from the International Air Transport Association

However, phasing out mask-wearing inflight would still depend on whether it is mandatory for other forms of transport and the rules individual countries may impose. Mask wearing on flights in Asia remains compulsory and on public transport and indoor venues, including shopping malls. Singapore is easing the rule but not for public transport and airlines.

Japan on Wednesday said it was no longer necessary to wear masks outdoors to protect against Covid-19 providing social distancing was practised.

A recent report noted that 18 airlines in the US phased out mask-wearing on their domestic flights and international flights to destinations where mask-wearing was deemed optional. However, here in Asia, inflight mask-wearing remains mandatory in most contexts and is likely to stay that way until Covid-19 is declared an endemic across the region.

IATA said on Thursday it welcomed new guidance from the European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA), removing its recommendation that masks should be required in-flight.

NCL completes Great Cruise Comeback



Norwegian Cruise Line celebrated on Monday the completion of its 'Great Cruise Comeback' with the sailing of Norwegian Spirit, the 17th and final ship in its fleet to return to service.

NCL's return to service after a 500-day pause began with Norwegian Jade's 25 July 2021 sailing from Athens (Piraeus), Greece. Since then, NCL has systematically relaunched its ships worldwide, welcoming guests and crew members aboard its award-winning vessels.

"This is an incredibly important day in our history and a defining moment for our future," said Harry Sommer, president and CEO of Norwegian



Cruise Line. "We are moving full speed ahead, having already welcomed more than half a million guests for an exceptional vacation at sea."

Norwegian Spirit, which is sporting an extensive bow-tostern, over USD100 million upgrade, will be sailing through the South Pacific, visiting eight ports in 12 days, with departures from the beautiful Island of Tahiti.

Itinerary highlights include a journey to Bora Bora, where guests can enjoy snorkelling and discover why the elegantly calm waters are world-famous. They also can venture to Raiatea, which is considered the most sacred island in the South Pacific, where visitors can spend the afternoon exploring lush rainforests and the extinct volcano, Mount Temehani. The itinerary also features other destinations for guests to









experience, such as Nāwiliwili, Kaua'i, where nature is truly the star. Nicknamed "The Garden Island," guests can admire scenic views of the Kokee Mountains and stop at the geological wonder, Fern Grotto, a lava-rock cave covered with tropical flora.

This cruise that started from Papeete, Tahiti, French Polynesia, Saturday, 7 May, ends on Thursday, 19 May 2022, in Honolulu, Oahu.

Norwegian Spirit will also debut in Australian waters for the

very first time on 22 December 2022 for her inaugural local sailing season. This will mark NCL's return Downunder after an almost three-year interval.

As part of the most extensive renovation in the company's history, Norwegian Spirit now showcases 14 new venues, additional and updated staterooms, enhanced public areas and new hull art. Enhancements included a doubled-in-size Mandara Spa that features a new thermal suite and relaxation areas. an expanded Pulse Fitness Center and the second Onda by Scarpetta restaurant at sea. New complimentary dining venues include an additional main dining room, Taste; the 24-hour eatery, The Local Bar and Grill; the allday dining outlet, Garden Café; the Great Outdoors Bar; and Waves Pool Bar. Stargazers head to La Palma Spain



Did you know that the Canary Island of <u>La Palma</u> is one of the best places to observe the stars on the planet?

The island known as the *"Isla Bonita"* (Pretty Island) is the first Starlight Reserve in the world, and thanks to this, it is protected in order to avoid light pollution. In addition, it has been a Starlight Tourist destination since 2012. What does this mean? That you will be able to carry out a multitude of activities where you contemplate the universe while respecting the environment at the same time.

If you have always dreamed of observing other planets or even other galaxies, or if you want to see inside one of the most important telescopes in the world, La Palma is your destination. Come and check out this Biosphere Reserve, where you'll practically be able to touch the stars with your hands.

Visit the inside of the Roque de los Muchachos Observatory

It is one of the most advanced telescope complexes in the world. You will find it at the highest point of the island, at about 2,400 metres, so the views from there are incredible. You can even see the neighbouring islands of Tenerife, La Gomera and El Hierro. This observatory also organises daytime guided



tours by specialised personnel. They will even show you the inside of a telescope and explain how it works.


Explore trails and astronomical viewpoints

You can choose between several astronomical paths that run through much of La Palma, such as the Roque de los Muchachos route, the route of the stars, the route of the full moon or the route of the full moon or the route of the sun. These paths pass close to professional telescopes such as the Gran Telescopio de Canarias (the largest optical telescope in the world) or petroglyphs, which could be connected to the way ancient inhabitants related to the sky (solstices, equinoxes, etc.)

Across the whole island, you'll find up to 16 astronomical viewpoints in a wide variety of places, such as Los Guirres beach, the San Antonio volcano

> or the imposing Caldera de Taburiente National Park. Each viewpoint has panels with a different theme: constellations, planets, the moon... Find information

about each one <u>here</u> and <u>download</u> a map that will be useful to you. Always check road access and the state of each path







before each trip since some may have been cut off due to the last volcanic eruption.

Enjoy astro experiences alongside a professional guide

Book one of your nights in La Palma so you can take a journey to the stars. That's what you'll experience if you book an astronomical tour. It involves an outing to a dark point on the island where a guide will help you identify constellations, recognise other planets, investigate other galaxies... And all with the help of the most upto-date telescopes.

And it's not the only activity you'll be able to enjoy. You can also sign up for an astrophotography route through the most photogenic landscapes of the island to practise night photography or an archaeoastronomy tour in which you will discover how the first inhabitants of the island (the Awara) worshipped the Sun, the Moon and some stars.

Staying at a Starlight establishment

Enjoying the night sky of La Palma is a unique experience. And doing it from the comfort of

accommodation prepared for this purpose is even better. On the island, you will find different "astro-themed" hotels and country house lodges. This means that they have instruments for observing the sky, such as telescopes, binoculars, etc.

In addition, you will see that this type of accommodation is located at points of the island that are far away from any light pollution and from where wide panoramic views of the sky can be enjoyed.

"Eat the sun"

Do you want to eat the sun, see and taste the atmosphere of some planets and the gases of nebulae? This is what a themed menu at some of the island's restaurants that are also committed to astrotourism, will offer you. You will find this type of restaurant in different parts of the island: from a salt farm in



the extreme south of La Palma to terraces with sea views.

Some of them are equipped with telescopes, binoculars, constellation image projections, astrophotos... As a lover of good food, you can also visit a Starlight winery, where they will give you a taste of wonderful typical wine from the island while they explain the night sky to you.

Take a stroll along with the stars of science walk.

It is located in the island's capital, Santa Cruz de La Palma, at the top of Avenida Marítima. Here, the stars do not belong to the world of cinema but instead are a tribute to figures such as Stephen Hawking, Samuel C.C. Ting, Takkaki Kajita and Aleksei Leonov.

Take a minute to observe the sky calmly. Few places in the world offer as many options for enjoying it as <u>La Palma</u>.

Who's on stage at Jazz in The Jungle?

One of the longest-running jazz festivals in the region, the Borneo Jazz festival is returning to Coco Cabana, Miri, Sarawak, from 24 to 26 June 2022.

Themed "Jazz in The Jungle", the 17th edition, will be held in a hybrid format for the first time Guaguanco, Samba, Calypso and Salsa, featuring sounds of percussion instruments from Latin America, Africa and Asia. Adding a unique Asian flavour to the sounds of AFRO ASIA will be Kamrul Hussin on Malay percussions and Sesatre Bansuri



to reach out to the greater jazzloving community worldwide. It will be joined by performers from over countries, namely Singapore, Japan, France, Switzerland, USA, and Hungary, not to mention the best names in Malaysian jazz.

This four-piece band, with its attractive technique and ensemble playing pop and classical melodies, will appeal to the young generation of the audience seeking a new sonic experience from attending Borneo Jazz.

From Singapore and the US, Alemay Fernandez & Richard Jackson will woo the Borneo Jazz audiences with their refreshing style and unmistakable chemistry.

Bringing Jazz, R&B and hip hop vibes to Borneo Jazz Stage is QSOUND, a graduate of the prestigious Juilliard School in New York City.

Next, MASIA ONE from Singapore. Born in Singapore, she grew up in Canada, where she earned her stripes in America and became inspired by her time in the Caribbean. Now this artist is reconnecting with her roots in Asia.

More names will be revealed in the coming weeks leading to the festival.
