

How Chiang Mai people keep heritage alive

Chiang Mai's appeal lies not just in what can be seen but in what can be felt. Its living traditions are carried forward by real people — artists,



gardeners, chefs, and craftspeople — who see heritage as something to be lived, not exhibited. In their hands, the city breathes.

A Boat That Floats on Story and Spirit

Gliding elegantly along the Mae Ping River, cradled in the sounds of live traditional music, the Dibba Yana Chitta—or "Heavenly Boat" — is one of northern Thailand's most spectacular vessels. Designed by Ajarn Chalermchai Kositpipat, famed for Chiang Rai's White Temple, the boat's figurehead is hand-carved into a mythical creature representing the

passage of humans along the river to heaven—an expression of the artist's lifelong devotion to preserving Thai identity through visual storytelling. With just 18 seats, this exclusive cruise blends sacred artistry with fine Thai dining. Each season, a new tasting menu is curated by leading Michelinstarred chefs, beginning with Chef Piyachart "Boy" Phudtawong of Saneh Jaan. Operated by Anantara Chiang Mai Resort, the experience is an immersion in culture — a passage through Chiang Mai's artistic, spiritual, and culinary heritage.

The Wisdom of Trees: Chiang Mai's Natural Archive

Spanning 12 lush acres in Chiang Mai's San Phi Suea Subdistrict, Changthong Heritage Park is more than a garden it's a living archive of Thailand's rare and historic green heritage. Visitors explore serene waterfalls, shaded woodlands, and a pioneering landscape that blends moss-filled paths with sustainable design, where century-old trees continue to thrive. The park is the vision of Boonrak Thanacharoenroj, a leading landscape designer with over 30 years of experience in transplanting and curating Thailand's grandest trees. Under his stewardship, the park has become a sanctuary for more than 400 rare plant species — many native to Northern Thailand.

Changthong Heritage Park invites families, students, and nature enthusiasts alike to engage with Thailand's botanical heritage — rooted









in history and growing toward a sustainable future.

Ban Kang Wat: A Sanctuary for Handmade Stories

Nestled against the slopes of Doi Suthep near Chiang Mai, Ban Kang Wat is a lively artist village where every doorway reveals a craft in motion. Artists display their work in colourful showrooms and craft markets, while workshops invite visitors to explore ceramics, accessories and jewellery, watercolour, woodcut printing, papermâché, and more. Within a vibrant space, Note A Book invites guests to try their hand at journalmaking, with local bookmakers guiding them through choosing cover materials, hand-binding pages, stitching patterns, and adding personal touches like handlettered titles.

A gentle reminder from the workshop: "When you read, you're reading the writer's heart—but when you write, you're reading your own."

Wisdom and Wellness Experience

Located in the Tai Khern community of San Kamphaeng District, Sahrey Chanta offers visitors a meaningful connection to nature and Northern Thailand's cultural heritage. Guests can



enjoy the healing power of food with a variety of nourishing dishes, cold-pressed juices, kombucha, and organic teas—including locally grown Assam tea and fragrant rose tea. The space also offers workshops and sessions as part of the experience, such as flower tea blending, yoga, and therapeutic massages. On-site shops offer a curated selection of spa and organic wellness products.

A homestay programme invites deeper engagement with the local community, offering a slower, more reflective pace of life. Sahrey Chanta was founded by Chiang Mai natives and siblings, Jumpol and Anchan Chaiwong, who were inspired to give back to and nurture their hometown.



Langkawi's hidden world of birds

Langkawi isn't just about beaches, dutyfree shops, or seafood dinners with a view. Look up or, better yet, pause for a moment, and you'll notice a quieter, wilder rhythm unfolding above and around you: birdsong



in the trees, silhouettes gliding between branches, flashes of colour darting across the sky. Welcome to Langkawi's hidden world of birds.

Langkawi lies just six degrees north of the Equator, where the equatorial and tropical



climate zones overlap. This unique position creates an ecological crossroads that supports a remarkable diversity of birdlife, especially for an island its size. Best of all, you don't need to be an expert or own expensive gear to enjoy it, even your smartphone camera will do the trick.

Forget the myth that birdwatching is only for the seasoned or the thoughtfully equipped. As the locals might say, your "Mark II eyeballs" will do just fine. Even a modest pair of binoculars can open up a whole new layer of Langkawi's natural magic.

Start with the raptors that command the skies above Langkawi. These birds of prey are a common sight in the mangroves, coastlines, and hillsides, often spotted gliding effortlessly on rising thermals. Look out for the White-bellied Sea Eagle, the Crested Serpent Eagle, and the unmistakable Brahminy Kite, with its striking chestnut plumage and white head, often seen circling above fishing boats or perched near the water's edge.

Deeper inland, in the island's forested highlands, hornbills add a touch of prehistoric drama to the treetops. The Great Hornbill, in particular, is a majestic presence on Mount Raya. With its heavy, curved bill



and unmistakable barking call, it's often seen gliding between fruiting trees in the early hours. A sunrise walk or drive up Gunung Raya offers one of the best chances to spot this iconic species in action.

In the cooler months, Langkawi welcomes migratory visitors. Herons, egrets, and other wetland birds fill the paddy fields in search of fish and grubs, turning these landscapes into seasonal theatres of activity.

Meanwhile, colourful residents like kingfishers and sunbirds dazzle with their plumage, if you're lucky enough to catch a glimpse before they vanish into the foliage.

Sunbirds, in particular, are small, shimmering nectar-lovers often spotted near flowering plants. Though not quite...




















RWMF call to action: One Earth, One Love

The 28th edition of the Rainforest World Music Festival (RWMF) 2025 concluded after an uplifting and unifying weekend inspired by this year's theme, 'Connections: One Earth, One Love'.

Now in its 28th edition, RWMF continues to evolve beyond music, offering an immersive journey that bridges continents, cultures, and communities through rhythm, sustainability, and shared humanity.

Held at the iconic Sarawak Cultural Village against the backdrop of Mount Santubong, the festival welcomed a record turnout of world music fans from 20 to 22 June. Over 200 musicians from 20 countries participated this year, offering a blend of traditional and contemporary music that spanned from West African percussion to Māori soul, Indigenous chants, and modern fusion.

The headline performance

Bangkok Molam International Band brought their signature psychedelic Molam groove to the stage. At the same time, Sarawak's own Meruked added emotional depth with their evocative blend of Bornean heritage and post-rock soundscapes.

"This year's theme,
'Connections: One Earth, One
Love', was more than a slogan
— it is our call to action," said
Sarawak Tourism Board CEO
Sharzede Datu Hj Salleh Askor.
"We are not just gathering for
music, we are here to celebrate
unity, honour the Earth,
and amplify the message of
sustainability through cultural
exchange. The world needs
connection now more than
ever."

Day one also marked the closing of the Rainforest Youth Summit (RAYS) 2025, during which youth leaders from across the region participated in sustainability workshops, cultural dialogues, and creative exchanges. The transition from RAYS to RWMF underlined the continuity between young voices and global rhythms — a powerful connection that defines the festival's spirit.

RWMF 2025 has established itself as a beacon of environmental stewardship. Building on its previous achievements, the festival reaffirmed its commitment to planting 10,000 trees by 2027, with a portion of every ticket going towards reforestation programmes. Single-use plastics are banned on-site, and visitors are encouraged to refill, reuse, and recycle through clearly marked Eco Stations and water stations.


